Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)?

The project was to provide funding to CCAP for a vocational scholarship to a student or students interested in purusing a career in the culinary arts. Scholarships will be awarded to students in Arizona, with a focus on the West Valley Area of Phoenix. The awarded students will be notified on April 18 2024. The original project was envisioned at a total cost of \$3,750. \$1,250 to be provided by the Rotary Club/Foundation of Verrado and the balance of \$2,500 from the approved District Grant. Subsequent to approval the Rotary Club of Verrado added \$650 to its contribution, for a total of \$1,900 from Verrado and \$2,500 from the District Matching Grant for a total of \$4,400.

The process of selecting scholarship recipients is based on a series of culinary competitions conducted by CCAP. CCAP will make the final decision on recipeints. All activities took place in Maricopa County, Arizona

Who were the beneficiaries? CCAP. To provided funds for a scholarship for education in the culinary arts.
