1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries

Our club served the local community with several projects. Our focus for these projects is primarily in the area of education, but we also used grant funds to serve our community in other areas:

- STEP – Supporting Teaching and Educational Programs is our club’s signature project and one which we have completed with the support of district grant funds for 15 years. The scope of STEP reaches a wide array of subjects and disciplines, including science, math, the arts, and special needs. STEP awards funded a myriad of educational necessities including books, teaching materials, student and classroom equipment, and adaptive learning equipment for special needs students
- Ronald McDonald House Meals of Love – Our members purchased, delivered, and served meals to the guests of - Ronald McDonald House in Orange.
- TOPSoccer is a recreational sports program for children and adults with intellectual, emotional, or physical disabilities. The program provides people with diverse abilities an opportunity to play soccer in a structured environment that is safe, fun, supportive, and inclusive. We prepared and served a lunch for the participants of the annual OC TOPSoccer tournament.
- Tyrol Plaza is a low-income senior housing facility. We served a Thanksgiving meal to the participants of the facility. Food was donated by a local restaurant, and we provided the service labor and purchased décor to add to the festivity of the event.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

The entire club has participated in “Serving Our Community”.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

- STEP grants are administered through a process which ensures fairness for all the schools and applicants. Program materials, including application and eligibility requirements, were sent to schools and learning institutions, and a committee of AHRC members evaluated all the applications. Award recipients (educators, principals, learning center directors) were invited to attend an AHRC meeting to present photos and videos of the project/supplies/program being used by the students and participate in Q&A sessions with club members.
- Ronald McDonald House Meals of Love – dinners for the guests of RMH were purchased, delivered, and served by club members. Interact Club members also participated in the project.
- TOPSoccer – meals were prepared and served by club members
- Tyrol Plaza – meals were served by club members

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

- For all these projects in total, hundreds of individuals (students, community members) benefitted from the club’s community service.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

- Supporting education, helping RMH continue its mission to help families with children undergoing critical care in OC hospitals, supporting the mission of TOPSoccer, and providing joy to those who may otherwise not have a holiday meal.
