Project Title: Stop the Bleed Disaster Preparedness

Progress Report Final Report

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Irvine Rotary collaborated with the City of Irvine Mayor's office, Irvine Police CERT Emergency Preparedness, the Irvine High School Action team volunteers, Orange County Fire Authority, Faulk Ambulance EMTs, the Rotary 5320 District Interact DG and interact leadership team, South County Outreach food bank, and Concordia nursing students, to teach high school students life saving first aid techniques to stop bleeding in the event of traumatic injury using tourniquets and bandaging techniques. Students participated in a live trading using mannequins. Students were introduced to Rotary volunteer opportunities with Interact and Rotaract as well as Irvine Police CERT(a city sponsored emergency response class for teenagers). The training was followed by assembly of 120 first aid and disaster kits by Rotarians and high school students for donation to low income families via the South County Outreach local food bank. Kits included extensive first aid household supplies, Orange County Fire Authority disaster planning materials, an Emergency shut off wrench, flashlight and batteries.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Irvine Rotary presented the "Stop the Bleed" training to high school students and provided a Stop the bleed flow chart to take home.

Rotarians participated in the preparation of first aid and disaster materials to be assembled with high school students, collaborated with Orange County Fire Authority to obtain disaster preparedness materials, helped the District Interact team set up a presentation table to attract high school students to Interact, aligned various community agencies to present disaster preparedness opportunities to students and helped assemble and deliver first aid kits and prepared notes of inspiration for families who received the first aid/disaster supplies.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

This is the second year of this project which is expanding and creating connections between numerous City of Irvine organizations and Rotary/Interact. Students learned life long first aid techniques and disaster preparedness which will benefit themselves, their families and third parties who sustain cuts, hemorrhaging, etc. for their whole lives and learned about opportunities to support their community in the event of a major disaster. Low income households obtain crucial first aid and disaster kits which help their families survive in the event of a natural disaster.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

- Orange County Fire Authority – Provided the "Stop the Bleed" presentation and Disaster Preparedness Materials and first aid practice supplies, including mannequins for student practice. Also provided a fire crew of firemen/paramedics who worked with students on bandaging techniques, tourniquets and compression techniques.
- Falck Ambulance EMTS – Provided EMTs who provided hands on first aid training to stop bleeding including training using bandaging techniques, tourniquets, compression techniques, etc.
- Concordia University – Provided nursing students for help in working with students in Stop the Bleed techniques.
- Irvine Police Department/CERT – Provided high school students with opportunities to take city run teen disaster preparedness classes
- City of Irvine HYSAT (High School Youth Action Team) – Provided location for venue and high school and middle school student volunteers and students to take the "Stop the Bleed" class and participate in first aid assembly.

- City of Irvine Mayor Farrah Khan's office - Provided short presentation re: the importance of keeping families safe and supporting rescue efforts to high school students
- Rotary District 5320 Interact District governor, Interact students and District 5320 youth leadership team – Set up an informational table and provided high school students with information about Rotaract and provided safety whistle keychains, limited amount of Starbucks gift cards and a Disaster Supply checklists to students attending the event.
- Irvine Rotary – Planning, funding and collaboration of project – Liaison will all other groups
- Rotary District 5320 – District Governor Nominee provided education about Rotary and opportunities for life long community service.
- South County Outreach – Provided education of their support of low income households and received and distributed the first aid and disaster kits through its local food pantry.
