Executive Summary on College Visits in Philadelphia and DC

The trip to visit colleges in Philadelphia and Washington DC with 13 members of The Black Diamonds was a transformative experience. The students had the opportunity to visit a variety of colleges, including Temple University, Cheaney University, Villanova, La Salle University, Morgan State University, Georgetown University, and Howard University. Additionally, the students were able to visit cultural and historic sites such as Mother Bethel AME Church in Philadelphia, Terminal Market, the Museum of Illusions, and enjoy themselves driving Go Karts and going to Kings Dominion.

The trip was made possible through generous donations from the Rotary Club of Peekskill, Peekskill School District, Westchester County Board of Legislator Colin Smith, and contributions from the students themselves. The total cost of the trip was approximately \$24,000. The purpose of the trip was to help them understand the college admissions process, expose the students to different college options, and allow them to explore campuses and determine what types of schools they prefer.

The potential impacts of the visit to the colleges include helping students gain a better understanding of what it takes to be admitted to colleges, providing them with a feel for different campus environments, and helping them decide if they want to attend college in or outside of New York State.
