Those entering Radiant Futures' programs have limited or no social and community networks. Our services help primarily females (95%): 60% had children and 98% live below the poverty line. We are the 3rd oldest domestic violence shelter in the US & offer services to domestic violence & human trafficked (DV/HT) survivors with complex needs and are at the highest risk of falling through gaps of service in our region. These 2 upcoming events help as the cost of caring for a family has skyrocketed. Back to School Event in August 2024 - Serving approx. 125 (DV/HT) survivors and children. Survivors fill their backpack with school supplies of their choosing. In addition, we will have a clothing boutique for survivors to pick out back to school clothes. By giving our survivors choice of picking out what they need/want instead of handing them a filled backpack, gives them back the dignity of choice. Thanksgiving Baskets in November 2024 - Serving approx. 125-150 DV/HT survivors and their families. We will need to purchase groceries to stuff baskets with items needed to cook and serve a Thanksgiving dinner. Without these baskets, many families will not be able to have a Thanksgiving meal.

Thanksgiving baskets - we have a few community and corporate groups who contribute in-kind items to be included with the baskets, such as turkeys. If we are able to order large quantities ahead of time, at a grocery store, they are willing to give us a discount.

For the Back to School event we would like 10-15 Rotarians to help set-up and tear-down for the day of event as well as assist during the event (passing out food, staffing tables for school supplies, helping with craft with children, etc.)

Thanksgiving Baskets - 8-12 (maybe more) Rotarians to assist in shopping for the items, inventory, help get the items ready for the packing of the baskets, and assist with assembling baskets.

We will be purchasing the items and will submit itemized receipts to the Rotary Club. The Rotary Club of Fullerton will disperse funds only when paid receipts are submitted for project expenses. To accurately measure outcomes, Radiant Futures employs the Apricot for Victims' Support software.

- 8. Describe how your club will use the project funds (list the types of expenses / items to be purchased):**

\$1,500 - Back to School: back packs, spiral note books, loose lined paper, printer paper, pencils, pens, tissue boxes, hand wipes, shampoo/conditioner, body wash, soap, paper towels, laundry detergent, laundry basket. For preschoolers: crib sheets, baby wipes, diapers and etc. Food to feed participants.

\$3,500 - Thanksgiving Baskets: spices (salt, pepper, sage, cinnamon, garlic powder, thyme, etc.), canned green beans, french-fried onions, canned corn, box mashed potatoes, roasting pan, gravy, box stuffing, canned cranberry sauce, cream of mushroom, sparkling cider, and turkeys.
