Keshav Seva Sadhana's Narayan Zantye School for special Children School is a Day Care Learning institute for the Specially Abled, in operation since 2004, situated in Bicholim town of Goa State. The School specializes in programs and teachings for children are who have challenges and disabilities that interfere with learning. The school lacks in Audiology & Speech Therapy, Physiotherapy, and Occupational Therapy equipped rooms which hinder the child's learning process. A teacher training program is also required for improved communication between the therapist and the child. The project's goal is to build up the three rooms above with a teacher training program for the school's students.

HUMANITARIAN PROJECTS - PROJECT PLANNING

Describe the community needs that your project will address.

As per a journal article published on National Library Of Medicine, in India, about 4-8% of the population is differently abled. One in every 10 children is born with or acquires a physical, mental or sensory disability. These translate into 40-90 million children, which is a substantial number. Moreover, only 35.29% of all people living with disabilities have access to schools.

Despite improvement in the health care system in the country, the situation of differently abled children remains deplorable, particularly in rural areas and among the lower socio-economic population. Differently abled children in India are subject to multiple deprivations and limited opportunities in several dimensions of their lives. Some of these include, not being enrolled to schools, lower employment rates, limited awareness of entitlements and services available and lack of social welfare support.

School is offering institutional Day care to such children for over 20 years in the rural township of Bicholim and have enrollments from almost 50 nearby villages. Children having neuro developmental disorders like Cerebral palsy, Autism, Learning Disabilities, Intellectual Disability and Genetic disorders like Downs

Syndrome, Rett Syndrome etc are given admission to the school and the number of applications to the school has been on the rise.

This project aims to equip the school with the latest updated medical equipment to assist the schools panel of Physiotherapist, Speech Therapist and Occupational Therapists, to help propel their practice for the most efficient results possible. This project also includes training program for the teachers that will enhance their ability to communicate efficiently with specially abled child and also with the therapist.

How did your project team identify these needs?

The project team is familiar with the operation of the school which has 175 specially abled students because it is the only institutional care unit in the Bicholim region that offers special education to children from Bicholim and adjacent Talukas near Bicholim. Furthermore enhancing this The doctors in our project team are experts in this sector. We discovered during our conversation with the school administration that the school did not have the required speech and audiology services. Whereas The physiotherapy and occupational therapy treatment rooms' equipment needs to be upgraded. The school lacked an appropriate program for teacher training that would have improved the teachers' abilities. Due to the above facilities' absence, the special child was unable to receive a proper education and recover to normalcy.

How were members of the benefiting community involved in finding solutions?

Teachers and therapists at schools are specially trained to work with children who have special needs. Additionally, they visited several special education schools and had discussions with the management. During their visits, they made clear to the administration the deficiencies in the current school infrastructure and the necessity of a teacher training program to improve the abilities of the teachers. The school staff has determined that in order to improve the exceptional child's overall development, a number of remedies are needed.

How were community members involved in planning the project?

The Bicholim Rotary Club operates a free medical bank within the club and often collaborates with the local primary and community health facilities on community health projects, therefore the club is aware of several cases of physical handicap in children throughout the region. The club has closely studied the challenges faced by a parent raising a physically able child. Our members are doctors and experts who, when visiting the school, discovered that it lacked the essential amenities needed for a school for the disabled. The members had a number of discussions with the parents and physicians of the local PHC. Members conversed

one-on-one with teachers to grasp their challenges in imparting knowledge to the children.

We propose a comprehensive training program tailored for teachers engaged in the unique challenges of special education. This training program aims to equip educators with the necessary skills, knowledge, and confidence to navigate the diverse needs of their students effectively. These training program will help the educators emerge as the maestros of their own classrooms, warranting the provision of skills that empower them to navigate their teaching responsibilities with heightened confidence. Providing them with self-help skills, a deeper understanding of how children develop, and updated knowledge about disabilities not only refreshes their professional perspective but also prepares them to face challenges with exceptional expertise.

Purpose is to train the teachers working with special needs to enhance pedagogical skills, to empower them for enhanced classroom as well as self-management.

Training will be held for following module

- 1) Understanding Developmental Milestones and Challenges Reviewing regular developmental milestones and common challenges faced by special needs children.
 - 2) New Trends in ADHD, ASD, ID Examining diagnoses, comorbidities, and

- contemporary treatment plans for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Autism Spectrum Disorder and Intellectual Disability.
 - 3) Role of Occupational Therapy Understanding the significance of occupational therapy in special education. Materials, methods which can be incorporated.

 Milestones and skills focused in OT across age 5-18.
- 4) Role of Speech Therapy Exploring the impact and importance of speech therapy in supporting children with special needs. Milestones and skills focused in ST across age 5-18.
- 5) Role of a Counselor Recognizing the role and benefits of counseling in a special education setting.
- 6) Academic Goals planningthe curriculum is taught by various teachers, the key is planning the curriculum as per our unique set of children. Guidance from a senior special educator on academic goal planning.
- 7) Use of Visuals in the Classroom setup and resource organization (Schedules, Communication book, etc. Understanding the pivotal role of visual aids in effective teaching. Visit by a senior special educator from a well renowned inclusive school can be arranged to observe and assist teachers to set up all the classrooms.
- 8) Behaviors Management Identifying challenging behaviors and their triggers. The importance of functional assessment. Practical solutions for effective behavior management.
 - 9) Mindfulness for Teachers Exploring personal values and their impact on teaching. Emotional regulation techniques for teachers. Introduction to self-help practices and mindfulness.
 - 10) Role of Play/Music/Dance/Sports Understanding the importance of various activities for the holistic development of children with special needs.
- 11) Setting up Parent Support Groups Exploring the importance of parent support groups and strategies for establishing them.

How were these needs identified?

Our team met with the school administration, parents, therapists, and teachers on a number of occasions. The treatment approaches and the teachers were found to have a significant knowledge and implementation gap. A thorough training program with improved facilities would aid in the child's quicker growth.

We intend to recognize the teachers and the therapists involved in the successful running of the project with an appreciation certificate.

School is a renowned institute and is already in operation for over 20 years, with a current strength of 177 students, with admissions all across the state of Goa, with Children from various cultural backgrounds.
